What are Neighborhood Councils?

The Neighborhood Council program provides an opportunity for Simi Valley residents to participate in local government at a grass roots level. The City of Simi Valley is divided into four Neighborhood Council districts. Every City resident 18 years and older is a member of their respective Neighborhood Council. The Neighborhood Councils meet once a month to:

- Advise the City Council and Planning Commission on development projects and resident concerns;
- Give developers the opportunity to dialog with residents and address concerns early in the planning process;
- Give residents the opportunity to voice their concerns in a less formal atmosphere than a public hearing before the City Council or Planning Commission.
